Application Notes for Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System with Avaya Equinox for Windows - Issue 1.0

Abstract

These Application Notes describe the configuration steps required to integrate the Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System with Avaya Equinox for Windows. Plantronics Hub Software enables the integrated call control features for Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Neckband Headset, including call answer/end and synchronized mute, with Avaya Equinox. The Plantronics Hub Software was installed on the desktop PC running Equinox. Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Neckband Headset connected via Bluetooth to a Plantronics BT600 Bluetooth USB Adapter connected to the desktop PC running Equinox.

Readers should pay attention to **Section 2**, in particular the scope of testing as outlined in **Section 2.1** as well as the observations noted in **Section 2.2**, to ensure that their own use cases are adequately covered by this scope and results.

Information in these Application Notes has been obtained through DevConnect compliance testing and additional technical discussions. Testing was conducted via the DevConnect Program at the Avaya Solution and Interoperability Test Lab.

1. Introduction

These Application Notes describe the configuration steps required to integrate the Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System with Avaya Equinox for Windows. Plantronics Hub Software enables the integrated call control features for Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset, including call answer/end and synchronized mute with Avaya Equinox. The Plantronics Hub Software was installed on the desktop PC running Equinox. Voyager 6200 UC connected via Bluetooth to a Plantronics BT600 Bluetooth USB Adapter connected to the desktop PC running Equinox.

Refer to the appropriate Plantronics documentation listed in **Section 10** for additional product information.

2. General Test Approach and Test Results

The interoperability compliance test included feature and serviceability testing. The feature testing focused on placing calls to and from Equinox using the Voyager 6200 UC and verifying 2-way audio. The type of calls made included calls to voicemail, to local stations, and to the PSTN.

The serviceability testing focused on verifying the usability of Voyager 6200 UC after restarting the Avaya Equinox, disconnecting and reconnecting the headset, and rebooting the PC.

Avaya's formal testing and Declaration of Conformity is provided only on the headsets/handsets that carry the Avaya brand or logo. Avaya may conduct testing of non-Avaya headset/handset to determine interoperability with Avaya phones. However, Avaya does not conduct the testing of non-Avaya headsets/handsets for: Acoustic Pressure, Safety, Hearing Aid Compliance, EMC regulations, or any other tests to ensure conformity with safety, audio quality, long-term reliability or any regulation requirements. As a result, Avaya makes no representations whether a particular non-Avaya headset will work with Avaya's telephones or with a different generation of the same Avaya telephone.

Since there is no industry standard for handset interfaces, different manufacturers utilize different handset/headset interfaces with their telephones. Therefore, any claim made by a headset vendor that its product is compatible with Avaya telephones does not equate to a guarantee that the headset will provide adequate safety protection or audio quality.

The testing referenced in this DevConnect Application Note included the enablement of supported encryption capabilities in the Avaya products. 2.1. Interoperability Compliance Testing

All test cases were performed manually. The following features were verified:

- Placing calls to the voicemail system. Voice messages were recorded and played back to verify that the playback volume and recording level were good.
- Placing calls to local stations to verify two-way audio.
- Placing calls to the PSTN to verify two-way audio.
- Answering and terminating calls using the call control button on the headset.
- Using the volume control buttons on the headset to adjust the playback volume.
- Using the mute button on the headset and Equinox to mute and un-mute the audio, including verifying that the mute status was accurately reflected on the headset and Equinox.
- Checking that the headset indicator indicates whenever there was an incoming call.

For the serviceability testing, the headset was disconnected and reconnected to verify proper operation. Equinox was also restarted for the same purpose. The desktop PC was also rebooted to verify that Equinox and headset were operational when the PC came back into service.

2.2. Test Results

All test cases passed. Note that Equinox must be started before Plantronics Hub so that Hub connects to Equinox.

3. Reference Configuration




Figure 1: Avaya Equinox for Windows with Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System

Figure 1 illustrates the test configuration used to verify the Plantronics solution. Avaya Equinox for Windows and Plantronics Hub Software were installed on a desktop PC running Windows 10. Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Neckband Headset connected via Bluetooth to a Plantronics BT600 Bluetooth USB Adapter connected to the desktop PC running Avaya Equinox. The configuration also included the following components:

- Avaya Aura® Communication Manager with an Avaya G450 Media Gateway providing media processing and connectivity to the PSTN via an ISDN-PRI trunk (not shown).
- Avaya Aura® Media Server also providing media processing.
- Avaya Aura® Messaging serving as the voicemail system.
- Avaya Aura® Session Manager providing SIP connectivity to Avaya Equinox.
- Avaya Aura® System Manager used to configured Session Manager and a SIP station for Avaya Equinox.


5. Configure Avaya Aura® Communication Manager


This section covers the station configuration for Avaya Equinox for Windows. The configuration is viewed via the System Access Terminal (SAT) on Communication Manager, but since Avaya Equinox is a SIP endpoint, a SIP station was configured through Avaya Aura® System Manager. The **Station Type** was set to *9641SIP* and a descriptive **Name** was also provided. The **IP Softphone** and **IP Video Softphone** fields were set to y. Use the default values for the other fields on **Page 1**.


6. Configure Avaya Equinox for Windows

Connect the Plantronics BT600 Bluetooth Adapter to the PC via a USB port. Next, ensure that the **Sound** properties under Windows 10 Control Panel are set properly. Verify that the Plantronics headset has been detected by Windows 10 and that it has been set as the default device in the **Playback** and **Recording** tabs as shown below.






After launching and logging into Equinox, click on **Options and Settings** to display the **Settings** window as shown below.



Navigate to **Settings** \rightarrow **User Preferences** \rightarrow **Audio/Video** to display the **AUDIO/VIDEO** window shown below. The BT600 Bluetotth USB Adapter is automatically detected by Equinox. Set the microphone and speaker fields to *Microphone (Plantronics BT600)* and *Speakers (Plantronics BT600)*, respectively, as shown below. Click **DONE**.





7. Install Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System

The Plantronics Hub software enables the Voyager 6200 UC headset to answer, end, and mute calls and adjust the volume directly from the headset. Install the software on the PC running the Equinox. Refer to [2] and [3] for additional information.

After the Hub software is installed, turn on the Voyager 6200 UC headset and then connect the Plantronics BT600 Bluetooth USB adapter to the desktop PC running Equinox. When the headset is paired via Bluetooth, a chime and "PC Connected" announcement should be heard on the headset. If the headset needs to be paired again, follow the instructions in [3].


Prior to using the headset, the Plantronics Hub software should be running and should have detected the headset and BT600 Bluetooth adapter as shown below. All default settings for the Hub software were used for compliance testing.





From the **Plantronics Hub** window above, navigate to **Settings Softphones** to display the **Softphones & Media Players** window. Verify that Plantronics Hub is connected to Avaya Equinox as indicated by the green checkmark \checkmark in the **Connected** column shown below.

Note: Avaya Equinox must be started before Plantronics Hub so that Hub connects to Equinox.



8. Verification Steps

This section provides the tests that can be performed to verify proper installation and configuration of the Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset with Avaya Equinox.

- 1. Start the Equinox application.
- 2. Place an incoming call to Equinox from any local phone.
- 3. Answer the call using the call control button on the headset.
- 4. Verify two-way talk path between the Voyager 6200 UC headset and phone.
- 5. Disconnect the call from the headset using the call control button.
- 6. Verify that the call is properly disconnected.

9. Conclusion

These Application Notes describe the configuration steps required to integrate the Plantronics Hub Software and Plantronics Voyager 6200 UC Bluetooth Neckband Headset System with Avaya Equinox for Windows. All test cases were completed successfully.
